Impact-24/7 Control Room at NHQ

O -ve is a very rare blood group. Finding donors is usually difficult, let alone in the lockdown period.

Recently a **90 year old patient was in need** of this blood group. Despite the family's frantic search, the required units were not available anywhere. Fortunately, their hopes were revived when the Control Room took the lead & arrange blood.

Our **Control Room is also reaching out** to all **371 O -ve VBDs** in its database to encourage them to donate blood during the covid crisis & save lives of people like the one above!

The team in Singrauli, Madhya Pradesh has been providing cooked food to thousands of such people who break their long journey for rest



Right to Food, Right to Life

Those who survived on charity or were dependent on restaurants have no where to go during this crisis. IRCS Odisha has been working tirelessly for such communities & has reached 6000+ people with cooked food till date



Home is Where the Heart Is: Supporting Send-Off

IRCS Vellore, Tamil Nadu has greatly supported the District Admin in arranging the send off of several people stranded in the State since the lockdown. The volunteers also distributed masks, sanitizers and wheel chairs among the needy. More than 1300-1500 people, including labourers, people under treatment at CMC Hospital, Vellore boarded trains each day between 7th & 12th May, 2020



<u>Relief Centres: Temporary Homes for the Needy</u>

Since the lockdown has been announced, many stranded, homeless & elderly have been living in relief centres managed by IRCS Nellore, Andhra Pradesh. These centres have become temporary homes for the beneficiaries. Not only are the inhabitants being provided good quality meals, regular medical camps are also being conducted. Volunteers ensure that social distancing is maintained at all times
