- Column 1 Number :** The numbers indicate the serial number of the candidates and the tests for each. The examiners will assign a number to each candidate and should invariably begin with No. 1. These numbers are repeated for easy identification of candidates in column 9.
- Column 2** Here insert the full name of the candidates in block letters as it is to appear on the certificate. Date of birth should be given as no Lay Lecturer will be below 21 years of age.
- Column 3** The signatures of the candidates should be obtained here.
- Column 4** Passed or Failed :—'P' should be inserted for Passed & 'F' for Failed. There will be 3 tests & full marks will be 100 as follows :
- i) **THEORY TEST**—25 marks (a) Paper 15 marks for 2 questions one for 10 marks and the other for 5 marks). Time allowed for answers will be 15 minutes. (b) Viva Voce one question for 10 marks to be answered in 2 minutes.
 - ii) **PRACTICAL TEST** :—25 marks. There will be 2 questions one for 10 marks and the other for 15 marks to be done practically in 3 minutes, to be selected from fracture, Haemorrhage, Art, Resp & Transportation.
 - iii) **DEMONSTRATION LECTURE** :—50 marks. Each candidate will be required to deliver Demonstration Lecture on any one subject selected by the board of examiners. The duration of the lecture will be 5 minutes.
- Column 5** In this column the total marks gained should be given. Minimum qualifying marks will be 60% out of which 30 will be in Demonstration Lecture. Lecturer failure to obtain 30 marks out of 50 in Demonstration Lecture will amount to total failure of the candidate.
- The examination will be conducted by a board of 3 examiners one of whom will be the lecturer of the class. The successful candidate will be awarded a certificate valid for 5 years which will be renewed if the candidates conduct 10 courses per year for 5 years.
- Column 6** In these columns all the tests are compulsory and Examiners must insist on a high standard being attained, to ensure that the candidates possess sufficient knowledge of efficient treatment of all sick and injured person.
